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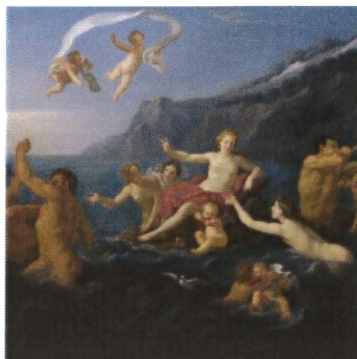

This exhibition aims to restore the rightful place of the work of Bon Boullogne (1649-1717) who, alongside Charles de La Fosse, Jean Jouvenet, Antoine Coypel, and Louis de Boullogne, was one of the five most celebrated artists in the court of Louis XIV.
